Journalism parents: Below you will find information regarding the grading procedures for Journalism. Please note the importance of this information, especially for seniors. Colleges will be able to see "Incompletes" on report cards. Grades will be issued for MP1, MP2, MP3, mid-term (semester 1 grade), MP4, MP5, MP6, and final (semester 2 grade). There are no actual exams for this class; however, students must complete their assigned pages and they must be "publishable" for the marking periods stated. Deadlines and Grading: Students are required to produce quality work and meet deadlines. This takes a tremendous and dedicated focus. Due to the nature of this class, students are graded differently than other classes. Grades will be posted for MP1, MP2, and MP3. The midterm will be based upon the completion of the first half of the yearbook and the students' assigned pages. For the midterm grade, student work must meet the

“publishable requirements.” If students do not meet these requirements, they will receive an “I” for incomplete. Students will then be required to make the necessary corrections. Each day the student’s grade will decrease one step. For example: Every student should be starting with 100% A+ if he participates and works every day in class and completes all assignments and projects. For “publishable quality”, if students need to make corrections, the grades will drop quickly. One day late = A, two days = A-, three days = B+, etc. Students will continue to work until the assignment reaches publishable quality. Students may have to work over Christmas break in order to complete work. Students can essentially fail the midterm, but will still be required to complete the assignment. This same policy will be applied for the second semester. Please note that colleges will be looking at the midterm and final semester grades. Students will receive an “I” at the end of the school year until the pages are complete. Students may have to work during the summer until the pages are ready to be published. The more time that is wasted on poor quality, the lower the final grade will be.
